The keypad interfaces with the ReadykeyPRO system by sending keypad data over the data output lines, or from a direct connection to the keypad interface. When a proximity card is presented to the reader, the red LED flashes green and the beeper sounds. Both the beeper and LED configurations can be controlled individually by the host system. An internal tamper switch sends an alarm condition if someone tries to disassemble the reader without authorization. It is also quite common that customers throw out
